Brady Street Lunch Tour:

Join us as we stroll through Brady Street, the ethnic enclave originally settled by Italian and Polish immigrants. Today, it is one of Milwaukee's hottest East Side neighborhoods. Did you know that the famous book, *Psycho*, was penned on Brady Street? Or the reason why many Milwaukee homes are referred to as a "Polish Flat?" This tour will teach you all that and more! Allow us to introduce you to authentic Italian eateries, then stop at the new establishments that revitalized this community, to enjoy samples that add up to a meal.



Craft Brewery Tour & Cocktails:

Milwaukee is filled with great breweries and distilleries to tour and sample. How is our tour unique? This tour is focused on discovering new craft brews and distilleries in Milwaukee – before they become famous! This is not a drunken pub crawl either. Enjoy this narrated, entertaining, and educational opportunity to meet the makers of craft beers and distilled spirits in Milwaukee, with responsible drinking along the way. All guests on our Craft Breweries & Cocktails Tour must be 21 or older.



Pizza Bus Tour:

Celebrate Milwaukee's pizza experience on one of our favorite and most popular tours! Join us as we explore the history of pizza in Milwaukee. Be sure to save room for dessert; this excursion concludes with a divine scoop of gelato!



Streetcar Lunch Tour:

Vogue Magazine recently named Milwaukee as the "Midwest's Coolest (and Most Underrated) City" – and we agree! Locals and visitors alike can join us for a narrated tour of the city's restaurant scene. Enjoy time aboard The Hop as we appreciate notable downtown Milwaukee landmarks. We then will walk from the streetcar stations to restaurants along the way, totaling about 1.25 miles of walking. At each of the eateries that we visit, you'll be able to indulge in the area's thriving restaurant scene with portions that add up to a meal.



Old World 3rd Street Tour:

Milwaukee's spanning RiverWalk, located parallel to Water Street, and the Milwaukee River include culture, history and foods of Old World 3rd Street. Those traditions are just the beginning of this tour where Milwaukee's old German traditions meet modern-day delights! We begin with a visit to Milwaukee's oldest microbrewery, and end when we 'schlemiel and schlimazel' our way across the Milwaukee River to pay homage to The Fonz. In between is our chance to introduce you to treasured stops complete with hot bacon salad, cheese, sausage, beer, sauerbraten, spaetzle, dessert to add up to a meal.

Options in Milwaukee (cont) :

Milwaukee Public Museum Entrance:



From the prehistoric Hebior Mammoth in the museum atrium to the hall of shells in our Living Ocean exhibit, the public floors of MPM (Milwaukee Public Museum) are filled with wonders to pique the interest of visitors both young and old. In addition to 4,000,000 specimens from all corners of the globe, take a small step back in time to the turn-of-the-century Streets of Old Milwaukee and European Village and to ancient Mediterranean civilizations. Or, take a giant leap back more than 65 million years to The Third Planet to see the world's largest-known dinosaur skull and a life-sized replica of Tyrannosaurus rex. Stroll amid free-flying butterflies from around the world in The Puelicher Butterfly Wing.

Milwaukee Public Museum Entrance & Planetarium:



In addition to the Entrance to the Milwaukee Public Museum (see above), the MPM's Planetarium is Wisconsin's largest and most modern, and is the first Planetarium in the world to debut a Digistar 6 computer projection system that fills the entire Dome Theater with stunning 3D animations, creating an immersive astronomy experience. You'll see breathtaking vistas of the night sky, planets, the Milky Way, and distant wonders of the universe.

Milwaukee Public Museum Entrance & Planetarium & Dome Theater:



In addition to the Entrance to the MPM (Milwaukee Public Museum) and Planetarium (both mentioned above), watching a show in the Dome Theater, with crystal clear images on a six-story-tall screen and wraparound digital surround sound, transports you into the center of the action -- be it climbing the daunting heights of Everest, cruising the skies on the back of a pterosaur, or experiencing the weightlessness of space.

Milwaukee Public Museum Private Guided Tour:



Sometimes when visiting a museum, one can become overwhelmed with too much to see or experience. On our private tour of the museum, your personal docent (guide) will take you through an informative tour of the museum focusing on the highlights of each collection. After your tour, you will have ample time on your own to return and explore those exhibits that were of particular interest to you.

Milwaukee Museum of Art Entrance:



Rarely does a museum's architectural design and details rival that of the exhibits inside, but the Milwaukee Museum of Art's iconic Burke Brise Soleil, unprecedented in American architecture, is a moveable, wing-like sunscreen that rests on top of the Museum's vaulted, glass-enclosed in the museum's Windhover Hall. While the Burke Brise Soleil has a wingspan comparable to that of a Boeing 747-400, its two ultrasonic wind sensors automatically close the wings if the wind speed reaches 23 mph or greater. The Museum's collections of American decorative arts, German Expressionist prints and paintings, folk and Haitian art, and American art after 1960 are among the nation's finest. An added bonus is the multiple traveling exhibits on display throughout the year.

Milwaukee Museum of Art Private Guided Tour:



On your personal guided tour through Milwaukee Museum of Art, your docent (guide) will not only walk you through the various exhibits on display giving you an more precise overview of the museum's collections and artists, but also describe the architectural features of this award winning design, comprised of three buildings designed by three legendary architects: Eero Saarinen, David Kahler, and Santiago Calatrava. Your private tour ends with more knowledge and appreciation of artwork perhaps not previously seen.



Pabst Mansion Public Guided Tour:

A docent-led 60-minute tour of the Pabst Mansion. Visitors learn about the Pabst Mansion, Pabst family and details about the architecture and furnishings of the home while exploring the first through third floors.



Pabst Mansion Private Guided Tour:

When Captain Frederick and Maria Pabst began construction of their new family mansion in June 1890, they could not have anticipated that it would survive and thrive into the twenty-first century as a testament to America's Gilded Age. Construction of the mansion Grand Avenue lasted for two years at a cost of \$250,000, an incredible amount of money at the time. Your tour will take you back in time to the Gilded Age (late 1800s to 1900), learning about the prominent Pabst family, the mansion's architectural features as well as period pieces.

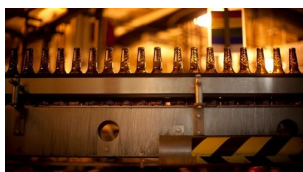

Miller Brewery General (Public) Tour:

Here in Miller Valley you will experience an indoor/outdoor guided walking tour of over 160 years of brewing history. Experience everything from Fredrick Miller's arrival in Milwaukee to the high-speed production lines used today. Your tour seamlessly blends the rich history of Miller Brewing Co. with the modern technology of today's brewing process. Our tours begin with a beer because... why not? We will immerse your senses as we take you back in time to our famous underground caves and historic, Bavarian-Style Miller Inn. Don't worry, you will rejoin us in the 21st Century as we move on to our modern operations including our Brew House, Packaging and Distribution Centers. Ice-cold refreshing samples of our finest brews will be served at various stops along the tour (and after!) for those 21 and older. Water and soft drinks are available for guests under 21 or upon request.



Miller Brewery Private Tour:

Want a more personal tour of the history and brewery process of Miller Brewery, than this tour is for you! Your personal guide will take you through the brew process explaining the delicate balance of ingredients that makes this famous long tradition American beer. On your tour you will also visit areas not typically seen on the General (Public) Tour, ending in the Miller pub room for that all important beer tasting!
